GENERAL GUIDE LINES FOR WRITTEN TEST

- 1.The question paper of each discipline/subject shall be an OMR based objective type question paper (MCQ) having 4 options out of which one shall be the correct answer.
- 2.In each question paper there shall be 80 questions of 90 minutes (I hour and 30 minutes) duration.
- 3. Each correct answer will carry 01 mark, however no marks shall be deducted for wrong answer if attempted by the candidate.
- 4. The maximum marks shall be equated to 40 accordingly.
- 5. The candidate has to fill the right option on the OMR with black or blue ball pen.
- 6. The Question booklet and OMR has to be submitted back by the candidate to the invigilators before leaving the examination hall. The used question booklets may be required for verification of roll no./ booklet series and other records. However, the carbon copy of OMR may be retained by the candidate.
- 7. No candidate shall be allowed to leave the examination hall before completion of written examination.
