2002-2007:	Became the legislator from Patan Vidhan Sabha constituency for the second time and proved the belief wrong that the Gujarat Education Minister cannot win consecutive elections. Was the Minister of Education (primary, secondary, and adult) and Minister of, Higher and Technical Education, Women and Child Welfare, Sports, Youth and Cultural Activity from the year 2002 till 2007.
2007-2012	Became the legislator from Patan Vidhan Sabha constituency for the third time. From 2007 to 2012, she was the Minister of Revenue, Disaster Management, Road and Building, Capital Project, Women and Child Welfare.
2012-2014	Was elected for the fourth consecutive time MLA from the Ghatlodia assembly constituency in the Ahmedabad city and won the most votes in the state. She was the Minister of Revenue, Drought Relief, Land Reform, Rehabilitation, Reconstruction, Road and Building, Capital Project, Urban Development and Urban Housing from 2012 to 2014.

M.J.P. Rohilkhand University was established in 1975 as an affiliating University. Its status was upgraded to affiliating-cum-residential university in 1985 when four teaching Departments were established in the campus. In 1987 three more Departments were added. Considering the dearth of professional programs in the Rohilkhand region, the university started Engineering faculty in 1995 with B. Tech courses in various branches and since then the University has taken a proactive approach and various new programs have been initiated. In August 1997 Rohilkhand University was renamed as Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Rohilkhand University. The existing faculties in the University are as under: -

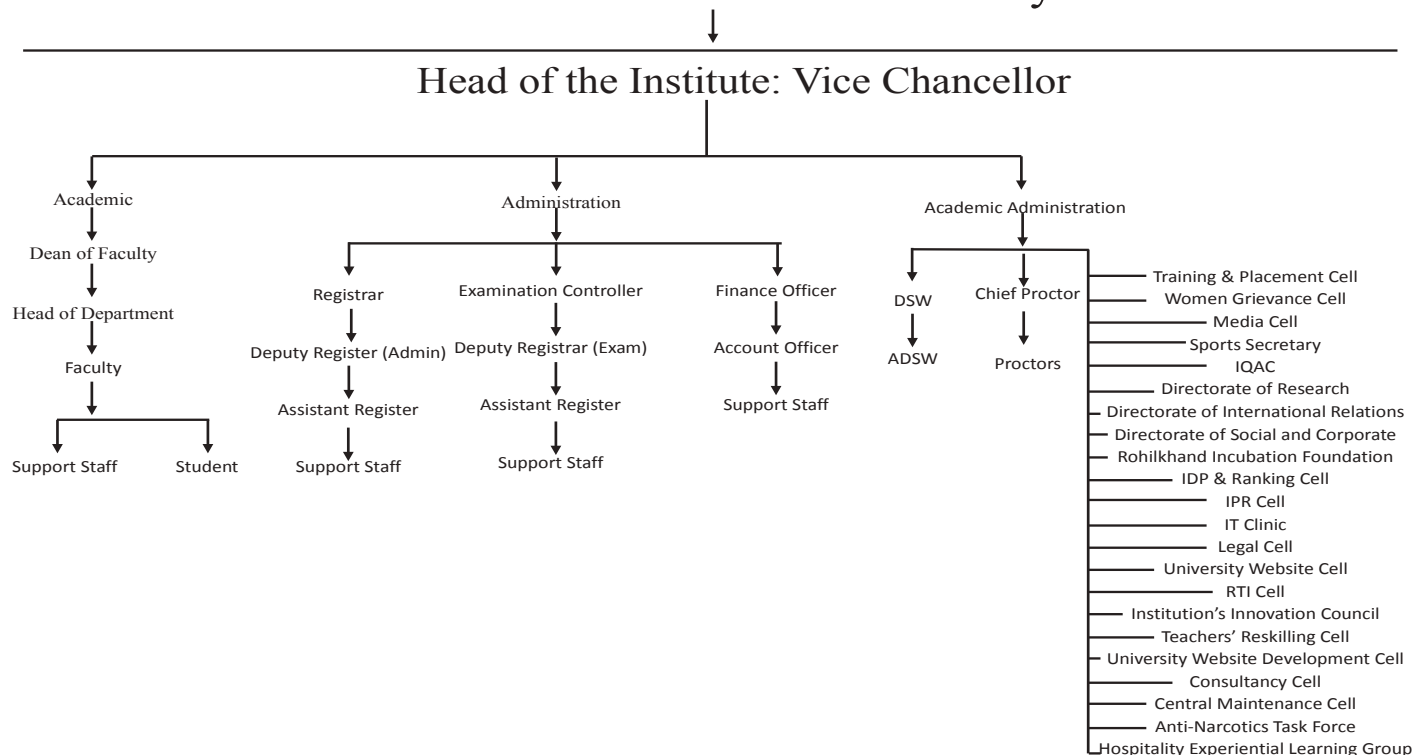

M. J. P. Rohilkhand University



MJP Rohilkhand University emerged as a pioneering institution in the state of Uttar Pradesh over the period.

Keeping in view its goals, objectives, regional, national and global requirements, The University has developed programmes which may be classified in the following manner:

- ➔ Doctoral Programmes
- ➔ Post-Graduate Programmes
- ➔ Under-Graduate Programmes in specialized areas
- ➔ Certificate, Diploma and PG Diploma Programmes of Vocational Nature.

The core programme are mainly at Masters level while professional, technical and vocational belong to under graduate level. The former includes M.A. (Ancient History & Culture, Applied and Regional Economics, Philosophy, Psychology and English, Functional Hindi and Pauli language and Buddhist Culture), M.Sc. (Plant Science, Animal Science, Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Microbiology) M.Ed., LLM and MBA whereas the latter encompasses degree courses in six

branches of Technology, Pharmacy, Hotel Management, B. Ed etc.

At present there are 28 university departments, 12 Government colleges, 09 Government funded affiliated colleges, 146 self- financing colleges and 04 constituent colleges. The University runs 45 Post Graduate, 14 under Graduate, 20 Diploma and 34 Doctoral Programmes. In most cases syllabi are revised annually. The University has Central Library, Computer Centre, Workshop, Primary Health Centre, Sports facilities including Indoor stadium, Track field etc. for outdoor games, inter-alia, as Central facility. More over electronic gadgets are regularly used for imparting instructions in the class rooms, laboratories and workshops.

As a matter of policy academic environment is, maintained in such a way that the faculty, Students and employees as three major pillars co-operate and strive to uplift the overall educational standards and atmosphere of the University. A regular feedback from faculty members and students improves academic standards in teaching and research.



- The University has been accredited by NAAC with A++ Grade having score 3.6 in year 2023.
- The University has received Category-I status by University Grants Commission, New Delhi in year 2023.
- The University has received a grant worth Rs. 100 crore under PMUSHA project of Central Government in year 2024.
- Special emphasis has been given to enhance the academic and research environment.
- The university has received a grant worth Rs 10 crore under ANRF-PAIR project.
- The grant worth Rs.2.5cr received from Uttar Pradesh Government, 0.65cr received IOCL and 05 start-up grant received from State Government by Rohilkhand Incubation Foundation a section 8 Company established by university in its mentorship.
- The university has adopted the Samarth portal and various activities have been started through portal, where as some others are in pipeline.
- M. J. P. Rohilkhand University has successfully implemented the National Education Policy- 2020.

- In recent NIRF ranking the university has been able to secure a position in the rank band 51-100 amongst the state universities and overall rank in the rank band 101-125 in Pharmacy category.
- The University has actively participated in various other ranking enlisted below where encouraging results have been obtained. Few of the results are still awaited.
- Sports facilities have been strengthened and up graded as a result the sports complex is second to none among stall state Universities.
- Several national and state level inter university-athletic and sport events have been organized by the university.
- A Fully functional Directorate of International Relations has helped in bringing global perception about the university as a result more than 70 students from Nigeria, Nepal etc. have taken admission in the session 2024-25 in various programmes of university.
- College Development Council has been established to fill the gap between university and colleges and for prompt disposal of college related issues.
- Faculty Restructuring has been done after approval of Hon'ble Chancellor and two new faculties namely Faculty of Agriculture Science & Technology and Faculty of Linguistics have been established in campus.

Various programmes at UG and PG level in the area of Agriculture have been started.

- The university adopted large number of TB patients and nutrition and medicines were provided to patients. Many of the patients have already cured and many are under treatment.
- Recognizing its social responsibilities, the University provided Nutrition to large number of pregnant women below poverty line.

MILESTONES DSCR (2024-2025)

Establishment of Sophisticated Computer Lab for Post Graduate and Research Students

The Department of Social and Community Research (DSCR) of Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Rohilkhand University (MJPRU) has set up a modern Computer Lab for postgraduate and research students in the CSIT Department. The lab has been established through CSIR funding supported by ICICI Bank, which provided ₹32 lakh for the project. The new lab is equipped with 50 high-configuration computer systems for research in Artificial Intelligence (AI) and the Internet of Things (IoT). The lab was inaugurated by Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor Prof. K.P. Singh, along with the Zonal Manager, ICICI Bank in the presence of Prof. Sanjay Kumar Garg (Director, DOR), Prof. Archana Gupta (Dean, FET), and Prof. Vinay Rishiwal (Head, CSIT Department) and other eminent faculty member of MJPRU and Guests.

**Establishment of Center of Excellence for Plant Tissue Culture and Protected Cultivation**

DSCR has submitted a detailed project for Establishment of State of the art Tissue Culture Laboratory under Center of Excellence for Plant Tissue Culture and Protected Cultivation for funding of Rs. 850 Lakhs under CSCR Budget of ICICI Bank. The main goal of the project is to establish a world class Tissue Culture Unit to fully harness the potential to increase production of uniform, fast growing and high quality plantations for livelihoods and economic development through mass production and supply of high quality, uniform and true-to-type planting material. There is always a huge demand by farmers for high quality planting material to cater to the need of their new planting programmes, especially,





fruit trees which are perennial in nature require special attention to select right quality of planting material at the time of planting, which otherwise will lead to uncertainty in the quality of tree after a initial growing period of more than 3 to 4 years. The tissue culture is proved to be one of the promising propagation technologies in many commercial crops for mass multiplication of quality planting of selected varieties. Keeping in view of the above objectives, it

is proposed to establish a state-of-art-tissue culture unit to enhance the productivity levels of important horticulture crops through promotion of use of high quality tissue cultured plants in the farmer's fields in turn to enhance the income per unit area and attain sustainable livelihood and economic development. The Project is under consideration and expected to be approved by ICICI bank very soon.

INTRODUCTION

Under the visionary leadership of Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor Prof. K. P. Singh and with the valuable guidance and suggestions of Prof. S. S. Bedi, Advisor, the University Website Development Cell continued its efforts towards the development, restructuring, maintenance, security enhancement, and continuous updation of the official website of Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Rohilkhand University, Bareilly, during the academic session 2025–26.

The University website serves as the primary digital interface for students, faculty members, research scholars, alumni, industry personnel, parents, and other stakeholders. During the year, significant improvements were made to enhance the website's functionality, accessibility, security, transparency, and dissemination of information. To ensure secure online communication and data transmission, a Secure Sockets Layer (SSL) Certificate was successfully implemented, enabling secure access through HTTPS protocol.

WEBSITE DEVELOPMENT AND INFORMATION MANAGEMENT

The Website Development Cell continuously updated and maintained information related to various academic, administrative, research, extension, and outreach activities of the University. Dedicated webpages and information modules were created, redesigned, and updated for various centres, cells, councils, and administrative units, including:

Dean Student Welfare (DSW), Proctorial Board, Atal Centre for Artificial Intelligence, Centre of Excellence for Multilingual Studies, Centre of Excellence for Women Studies, Consultancy Cell, Grassroots Innovation Centre, Hospitality and Experiential Learning Group, IDP & Ranking Cell, Institution's Innovation Council (IIC), Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) Cell, Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), Media Cell, Legal Cell, Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay Shodhpeth, Teachers Reskilling Cell, Training and Placement Cell, Women Grievance Cell, University Website Development Cell, Google Map integration and other essential contact information were also incorporated to improve accessibility and user convenience.

ACADEMIC RESTRUCTURING AND FACULTY DEVELOPMENT

The academic restructuring undertaken by the University during 2025–26 was comprehensively reflected on the website. Two new faculties were established:

Faculty of Agriculture Science & Technology, Faculty of Linguistics. Accordingly, the website structure was revised and updated to accommodate new faculties, departments, programmes, and academic units. A dedicated section was developed for the newly established Faculty of Agriculture Science & Technology. Individual webpages were created and uploaded for the following departments: Department of Agricultural Science and Technology, Department of Agronomy, Department of Genetics and Plant Breeding, Department of Plant Pathology, Department of Entomology, Department of Horticulture. The webpages provide comprehensive information regarding academic programmes, faculty members, research activities, laboratories, infrastructure, achievements, and extension activities.

The Faculty of Life Sciences section was extensively updated and expanded. Dedicated webpages were developed for newly established departments: Department of Environmental Science, Department of Bioinformatics and Computational Biology. The updated webpages provide information related to departmental activities, research facilities, academic programmes, faculty profiles, and student opportunities.

NEW ACADEMIC PROGRAMME:

During the academic session 2025–26, the University launched a new undergraduate programme, B.Tech. in Artificial Intelligence, under the Department of Computer Science and Information Technology (CSIT).

The Website Development Cell updated and restructured the CSIT Department webpage to incorporate complete details regarding the programme, including eligibility criteria, curriculum, admission process, programme outcomes, and career opportunities. This initiative strengthened the visibility of emerging technological programmes offered by the University.

ESTABLISHMENT OF NEW ACADEMIC CENTRES AND CHAIRS

Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Research and Study Centre: A dedicated webpage was designed and developed for the newly established Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Research and Study Centre. Information related to its objectives, research activities, publications, seminars, conferences, and outreach programmes was uploaded to facilitate wider dissemination of knowledge concerning the life and contributions of Mahatma Jyotiba Phule.

CENTRAL LIBRARY

Shri Romesh Bhandari on 13th February, 1997. With the rapid development of the university, library needed much more space therefore the then vice-chancellor Prof. Z.H. Zaidi took necessary step in 2003 for the expansion of building. The expanded portion was completed in 2005 and was inaugurated by the then Vice President of India Shri Bhairon Singh Shekhawat on 4th February, 2005. Besides this, departmental/seminar libraries are also established in some departments viz. Faculty of Engineering and Technology, Faculty of Education and Allied Science, Faculty of Management, Faculty of Law, Faculty of Social Science and Faculty of Science.
